Full Burn Ban in Island County

Due to high fire danger and expected hot and dry weather conditions, a modified outdoor burning ban for the unincorporated areas of Island County will go into effect **Thursday, July 30, 2009 at 8:00 AM. This restriction bans all outdoor burning in Island County. The only exception is recreational fires in COUNTY, STATE, PRIVATE or NATIONAL camp grounds with a Park Ranger or a Camp Ground Host. ALL fires are to BE EXTINGUISHED by 10:00 pm nightly. NO PRIVATE HOME OWNERS WILL BE ALLOWED TO HAVE CAMP FIRES.**

As always burning garbage and the use of burn barrels is illegal state wide and subject to fines up to \$1,000.00.

A permanent ban on open burning remains in effect in the Cities of Oak Harbor, Coupeville and Langley their urban growth areas (Freeland also would be included in the "urban growth area.") If your property falls under the jurisdiction of the Department of Natural Resources, please call (360) 856-3500 for burn permit information. Washington State Parks and National Parks are subject to their own rules and regulations relating to burn bans.

This modified burn ban will be in effect until further notice. You may obtain updated County burn restriction information by calling the Island County Fire Warden at (360) 391-0392.
